EVENT OUTLINE In the eyes of young Europeans, vis-à-vis China, politically so heavy and economically so powerful, Japan, as an economic-political entity, would not have as much attraction today as before. Certainly, we would speak well of Japanese subcultures, socio-economic-politically. But, how else can Japan still give rise to more or less inventive socio-scientific research (political, economic, sociological, anthropological, socio-psychological, etc.) in Europe? And, in the present world conjuncture, what could such research mean? These are the questions that arise and are discussed during the workshop at CEEJA in November 2019.
